FEATURES	DESCRIPTION
Credit Hours	Undergraduate Bachelors degree credit hours requirements by program and a minimum of 24 credit hours of graduate courses works in your fifth year.
Requirements to begin taking graduate courses as an undergraduate	GPA of 3.25, 95 credit hours, and approval of the department chair
When to apply	End of the third year or beginning of fourth year

FINANCIAL AID*

Scholarship	UDM undergraduate scholarship/grant etc. continue in fifth year
Additional Scholarship	MI residents may receive up to \$2300/yr in fifth year (depending on courses load, need, etc.)
Departmental scholarship/Teaching	May receive additional funds from the department
Loan	Students loans (up to \$18,500/yr) are available for the fifth year
Tuition	Students pay graduate tuition in their fifth year
Student Status	Students must enroll as full time students in their fifth year

*Names of students approved for the program should be submitted to the Financial Aid office prior to their fifth year. Students should keep in close communication with their financial aid advisor to maximize their financial aid package. Students should contact Financial Aid Office

What is the Bachelors/Masters Program?

The Bachelors/Masters program is an academic program that allows students to obtain both a Bachelor degree and a Masters degree (ME) in Engineering in 5 years. Through this special program, qualified students can begin to take graduate courses during their senior year and these can be used toward satisfying their Master degree requirements. This combined with the continuation of financial aid, make this program very attractive by reducing the time and cost that students need to invest to obtain their Masters degree.

Why would I want to enroll in a Bachelors/Masters program

The combined Bachelors/Masters program allows a student to complete both degrees in 5 years. Traditionally, when a student enrolls in a Masters program after completing a 4-year Bachelors program, the total commitment is about 6 years. A Masters degree in Engineering would position a student more favorably in the job Market.

Are there scholarships, teaching assistantships or financial aid available?

Overall, financial aid counselors keep in close contact with students in the program to maximize the financial aid package throughout the entire 5-year program. Any UDM scholarships or grants awarded to undergraduate students will continue into their fifth year. In addition, the department has several academic scholarships, summer research opportunities, and teaching assistantships available to students enrolled in this program.

When do I apply?

A student who is interested in the program submits an application of the Department of your interest. This is usually done near the end of third year or during the fourth year.
